# TNSSAR Membership Secretary 2020 Year End Membership Report (Total Membership 31 December 2020)

Gains in TNSSAR membership were exceptional during 2020. However, retention of existing and new members once they were inducted into the Society in 2020 became a major issue of membership loss.

The Society began the year with a total of 1,274 active members. Total gains were 185 including Memorials, losses for Memorials, resignations, Transfers-Out and members requesting drops for health reasons were 38 and drops for non-renewing members was 116 for 2020 resulting in net gain of 31 members.
