DUTIES OF THE STATE PRESIDENT

The State President Shall:

- 1. Preside at all meetings of the Society and shall exercise the usual functions of a presiding officer under Robert's Rules of Order and the Constitution and By-laws of the Tennessee Society Sons of the American Revolution.
- 2. Arrange for and preside over the Annual Membership meeting of the Society and three meetings of the TNSSAR Board of Governors.
- 3. Attend and represent the State Society at National Trustees' Meetings and lead the delegation to the National Congress on an annual basis.
- 4. Perform such representative duties as become necessary on behalf of the State Society either in person or by correspondence. It has been the tradition in the Tennessee Society that the State President makes every effort to attend one of the local Chapter meetings of each Chapter during his term of office. These meetings may be a single Chapter meeting or joint meetings of two or more Chapters.
- 5. Advise the President-elect of the status of the State Society in order to allow a smooth transfer upon surrender of the office.
- 6. Direct the activities of all other State Officers.
- 7. Appoint all Committee Chairmen for the standing committees outlined in the Constitution and By-laws of the Tennessee Society. Most Presidents allow the Committee Chairman to appoint the constituent members of the Committee. However, there is nothing that prohibits the State President from appointing all Chairman and Committee members unless specified in the By-laws.
- 8. Be listed as the primary officer of the Corporation in the Office of the Tennessee Secretary of States.
- 9. Endeavor to keep good order and harmony throughout the Society.
